Please list three to five significant activities for the most recent reporting period (4/1/07 – 7/31/07) and provide a brief description of each:

- Focusing on faculty development initiatives that can be supported and sustained through current and developing institutional support infrastructures, we continue to work with our SDSU partners (Center for Teaching and Learning, Instructional Technology Services and the Department of Educational Technology) we developed our summer fellowship program with a course re-design approach with the idea that this cohort will work for 1-3 semesters to re-design their courses guided by a 21st century learning outcomes approach, that: 1) incorporates a developmental iterative model to design a blended computer mediated teaching approach; 2) maximizes deeper student learning; 3) creates faculty learning communities to enhance peer support, learning from common experience and sustainability.
- Following the strategy of working more closely with fewer faculty who teach high enrollment courses, we selected eleven faculty fellows into the 2007/08 faculty cohort. This selected cohort has the potential to impact over 8000 students annually. The faculty fellows were assigned to participate in one of 4 faculty learning communities (to facilitate peer support and learning from common experience) Each faculty group was assigned an instructional designer and consultant to work with throughout the year in the course re-design process
- With our partners we developed a four-day workshop for the 2007/08 faculty cohort. Faculty from across the university and the CSU Chancellor's office were invited to attend the first day of the workshop which featured Chuck Dzuiban, a nationally recognized expert on Blended Learning and Hybrid Courses in Higher Education. Over 200 faculty attended the first day workshop.
- We applied for and received funding from the CSU Chancellor's office to provide a formative evaluation framework to facilitate development of well-designed blended computer-mediated and face-to-face instruction approaches throughout the CSU System.
- SDSU's pICT program has been recognized as a model of course re-design for the CSU system and the CSU's Chancellor's Office has retained the pICT Assistant Director as a consultant on a system-wide course redesign initiative.
